Looking forward, 2024 has big plans on the horizon:

- A fundraising goal of just over \$2 Million

- Radio campaigns targeting new audiences who haven't yet heard of us but they soon will!

 within the realm of a "Barrier Free Canada."
- Additions of dedicated, connected Board Members to add to the passionate group of the existing Board.
- Individual giving campaigns to third-party community events in support of Shine.

We will fulfill 65 Shine Dreams in 2024, knowing that the positive ripple effect of Shine's program on a Dreamer's family, friends, and community is at times immeasurable.

Without the involvement of Shine, many young people see themselves as having a disability first and




SHINE DREAMS OVERVIEW 2023


Statistics gathered from our 2023 dreams show the diversity of those we serve:

The stories told below mark just the start of a brighter future for our Dreamers.

ERIK'S ACTIVE FUTURE IN HIS COMMUNITY



As a kid, Erik dreamed of becoming an RCMP officer, but he didn't think a future in policing would be possible as his condition began to decline. Instead, he focused on another interest, bike riding, to improve his fitness and explore his city.

Erik worked with Shine on a customized experience that included an e-trike equipped just for him. As a surprise, he was presented his e-trike at the RCMP headquarters where he received a personalized tour.


On his tour, Erik explored various divisions, rode in an armoured truck, and received an introduction to law enforcement that helped him explore opportunities that suited his abilities. His sights are now set on an active future behind the wheel of his e-trike and volunteering in his community.

"Very often when there's a difficult conversation, he turns to me to say the words. But this time, he took control and got his message out there. For me it was a very powerful moment because he found his voice and now I know he can use it and he's been using it more in other places since. So for building confidence, it was very very powerful." - Erik's mom.

JOCELYNE TUNES INTO GREATER SELF-ACCEPTANCE

Jocelyne found solace in her passion for timeless rock music like Elvis, The Beach Boys, and Motley Crue, a music taste she shares with her dad. Beyond the immediate delight of her new audio entertainment system, the process of receiving her Shine Dream sparked a positive transformation within Jocelyne.

Jocelyne now embraces her disability and feels more open to share details of living with Ehlers-Danlos syndrome with her new friends. She is more confident and accepting of her identity as a person with a disability and looks forward to turning her passion for music into a successful future in the industry.



MAGGIE'S RECORD-BREAKING HOT PINK RACING CHAIR

Maggie, a determined para-athlete with a passion for speed, faced a hurdle in her racing career due to the lack of a custom-fit chair. Despite her dedication and skill, the borrowed chair strained her body, hindering her goal of competing in the Paralympics.

Overwhelmed with the realization that a new chair was no longer a barrier, Maggie couldn't help but feel emotional: "It just makes me feel important and seen, and that people want to see me succeed out there, and that just means the world to me."

Maggie has since broken two personal best records! Not only is she riding faster, but she can now train longer free of pain.

JOSH'S HOME GYM TRANSFORMATION

Josh finds comfort and strength in daily exercise, crucial for both his physical and mental well-being, but working out in a shared gym had been frustrating and intimidating. With a new custom home gym, he can now work out on his own terms, free from all barriers.

Josh shared, "This has impacted my life in a gigantic way and given me so many opportunities for what I can do with my life and the space. I'm excited about my future, and where I can go with it."

Josh's ever-growing strength and confidence is motivating him to pursue new fitness goals. He plans on exploring a career as a personal trainer as a result of the positive experience he's had in his new space.


