SHINE DREAMS OF 2024

Shine fulfilled 65 unique Dreams for young people aged 11-21 living with severe physical disabilities across Canada this year. These Dreams helped overcome barriers and complete goals while they provided the Dreamer with tools that fostered greater independence, a sense of purpose, and a brighter future ahead.

From Xavier's 'foodie' adventure in Edmonton to Alexy's Grand Prix race in Montreal, Shine Dreams are tailored to each individual. Laela learned from the *Cavalria* horse trainers, Elysanne received her very own keyboard, and Kaitlyn explored historical sites on the East Coast in an RV. Ajla and Keerthana received technology to support their vision loss, while Destinee received tech gear to help her graphic design business.

Many of the young people we serve face significant barriers and health challenges and are often not eligible for programs from other organizations. Most of the financial, medical, and emotional support weighs on the shoulders of their families.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

In 2024, Shine fulfilled 65 powerful, life-changing Dreams - and every one of them was made possible by the drive, heart, and belief of this community.

Together, we helped young people like Aven, Connor, Ajla, and Keerthana access groundbreaking adaptive equipment, expand their independence, and see themselves *SHINE*. Through new partnerships and bold outreach - like our CN Tower EdgeWalk challenge with Q107, and the "Our Community" segment on Accessible Media Inc. - we invited Canada to understand Shine's mission in new and unexpected ways.

We also faced real headwinds. With 61% of Shine donors giving by mail, the Canada Post strike in November and December—months that account for 1/3 of annual donations - had a major impact. But our team leaned in, hosting more events, launching Come to Sleigh: a para-ice hockey event showcasing an accessible sport, and opening up new giving channels to finish the year strong and complete the 65 unique Shine Dreams.

This is who we are: resilient, creative, and fiercely committed to empowering young people living with severe physical disabilities. Thank you for supporting us in 2024 and for helping to create futures full of possibility.

As a Trailer Park Boys superfan, Maria found comfort in their comedy - especially after losing her older brother who first introduced her to the show. During her Shine Dream, she visited the set, had an exclusive invitation to join their podcast, and was showered with props, stories, and a swag bag any fan would envy. *"I can't do everything everyone else can do... but didn't feel that way during my Dream,"* she shares after developing a friendship with the cast. Maria now feels more confident and is motivated to care for herself inside and out.

LAKSHMI AT PARLIAMENT

Lakshmi lost her vision to Retinoblastoma and is aspiring to become a lawyer or politician. She once felt her ambitions were out of reach. Through her Shine Dream, Lakshmi attended Parliament for the day, meeting with an MP and lawyers living with vision loss who shared their journeys and the obstacles they've conquered. This empowered Lakshmi with the confidence to reach for the stars and consider becoming the Prime Minister.

TAHA'S SLAM DUNK DREAM

Taha is a sports enthusiast who watches basketball and soccer to get him through tough times like recovering from multiple surgeries. His Shine Dream to watch his favourite NBA teams: the Raptors play against the Golden State Warriors was a total VIP experience, topped by a meet-and-greet with Steph Curry. *"My face hurt from smiling all night. My Dream made me feel recognized for who I am beyond my disability. It's a day I will never forget."*

BACK ON THE BIKE TRAILS

Aven was a competitive downhill mountain biker and adrenaline junkie before an accident flipped his life upside down. Everything he poured his heart into was suddenly gone and he now needs assistance for almost everything. With Shine's help, he found adaptive equipment that would get him back on the trails, steering around rocks and trees independently again. *"I didn't believe it at first - but after it sunk it, I realized I get to bike again!"* Leaning into his disability, Aven is a social media influencer in the accessibility space.

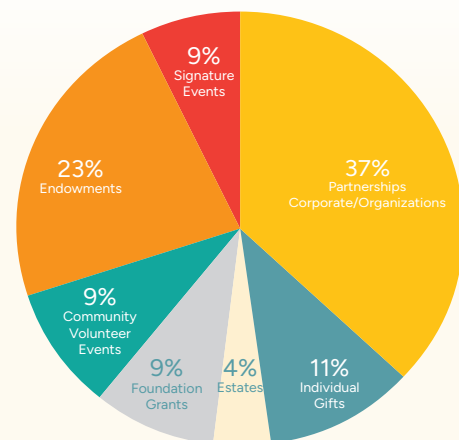
